

PREFACE

Pocker Sahib Memorial Orphanage College was established in July, 1968 as an aided junior college, affiliated to the University of Kerala under the management of the Tirurangadi Muslim orphanage committee (Regd.). Consequent upon the University re-organization, the college came under the University of Calicut in the same year. It was upgraded as a first grade college in 1972 and a Post Graduate College in 1980. Three of the Departments have been recognized as Research Centres. It has emerged as one of the premier institutions of higher learning under Calicut University in terms of infrastructure, programmes, staff and student strength. At present, ten Under Graduate programmes and seven post graduate programmes are offered at the college catering to the higher educational needs of around 1800 regular students and around that much part time students through the IGNOU study centre. The college has completed 53rd year of its academic journey. Throughout this journey the college have been vigilant in providing quality education to the students.
