3 A one day international seminar was organized on 'Tunes and Times: Musical Voyages Across the Indian Ocean' on 4 January 2018. A film screening and discussion on 'Sidi Music and Mappila Songs' were also part of the programme. Amy Cathlin-Jairazbhoy, Professor, Dept of Ethnomusicology, University of California and Neelima Jayachandran, PhD Fellow, Africana Research Centre, Pennsylvania State University were the prime discussants of the session.

Prof. Amy brought the classic *mappila* songs of Malabar which were recorded by Arnold Bake of University of London on 19 and 20 April 1938. Those songs were sung by the famous *mappila* singers hailing from Malappuram, Mamburam, Parappanangadi and Pullangode. Manuscript or audio record of no such songs exists in India at present, which were kept in the archives of California University. Leading play back singers like Mr. Firoz Babu, Mr. Faizal Elettli and Mr. Mohammed Haseeb N. sang *mappila* songs for the archive. Dr. K. Azeez, principal, was the chair.

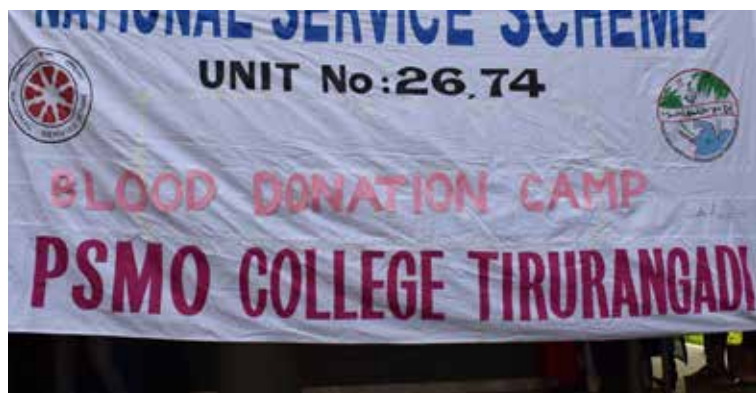

STUDENTS INITIATIVE IN PALLIATIVE (SIP)



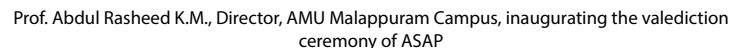
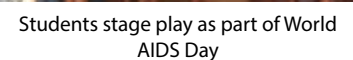

FIELD WORK OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY

A group of paddy farmers from Cherumukku, Nannampura, Tirurangadi, consulted the Department of Zoology, PSMO College, where entomology is the specialization in MSc Zoology course, seeking scientific advice regarding the drying of paddy leaves. On 11th Dec 2018, a team of 12 students of M.Sc. Zoology and members of the staff of the department visited the pest infested paddy fields to study the case and found that the problems were due to Brown Plant Hopper attack. The team noticed a heavy infestation of *Nilaparvata lugens*,

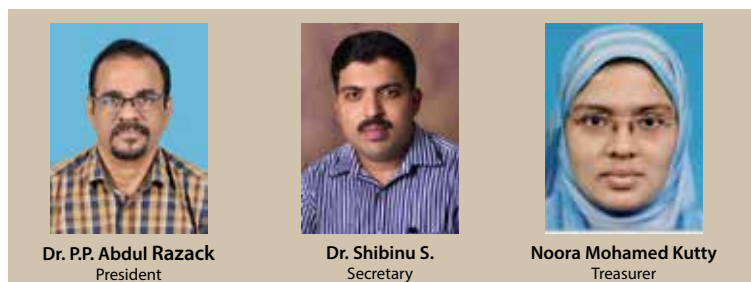
commonly called Brown Plant Hopper (BPH) on the rice crops and caused 'Hopper burn'. The team tested the field soil from the department laboratory and came to the conclusion that this mass attack might be the over usage of nitrogenous fertilizers like Urea and some insecticides which led to the outbreaks by increasing the fecundity of BPH and by reducing the population of natural enemies. Scientific advices were given to the farmers accordingly and explained the reasons, mode of infestation and measures to curb or limit the cases.

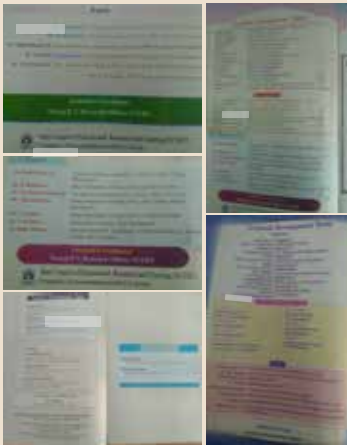

IT is believed aided educational institutions are where merit matters less and money speaks volumes when it comes to staff appointments and management quota seat allocations.

Not at the Pocker Sahib Memorial Orphanage College, though. Thanks to its practices, the college at Tirurangadi with its 50-year history will not allow one to come to such conclusions. Since its inception in 1968, the PSMO College management has not taken a single rupee for appointing staffers or admitting students, all because of an alumni association which strives to keep this tradition intact.

With a strength of over 40,000 members, the ex-students' association has been active in vari-

ous matters, from extending financial support to distributing scholarships and organising events.

As per the figures with the college authorities, the college's alumni recently spent ₹25 lakh for building a digital library and ₹15 lakh for purchasing vehicles for the institution. An auditorium was also built at the college with a contribution of ₹10 lakh from the members. This in addition to the ₹5 lakh the alumni spend annually on student scholarships.

"Our alumni are keen to help as they want to assist the college keep its pride," says principal K Azeez, himself a former student of the college. Alumni Mujeeb Thanaloor says what draws old students towards their Alma Mater is the management's unflinching stand on not seeking

money from any candidate. The association has 15 chapters, including seven in GCC.

So far, the college has appointed 130 teaching staff. Forty non-teaching staff were recruited following retirement.

The college has a total of 70 teaching and 22 non-teaching staff posts. In various departments, the college has around 340 seats under management quota. "These management quo-

ta seats can be filled by taking donations. But we are obliged to keep the word given to our visionaries who stiffly opposed taking any money for the same. We are not doing anything new, but simply following their footsteps," said PSMO College manager M K Bava.

The college's practices stand in stark contrast to many aided schools and colleges which levy up to ₹40 lakh from candidates

for one post. In fact, Bava's father and PSMO College founder M K Haji once told the college functionaries to close the college and hand over its key to the government if they failed to run the institution without taking money.

As part of its golden jubilee, the PSMO alumni has planned a meet at the college on Saturday. More than 10,000 alumni are expected to attend.

RESEARCH PROJECTS

SERB-DST YOUNG SCIENTIST PROJECT

The livestock industry substantially empowers the Indian economy and gives employment to millions of people in the country especially for women. Despite having highest livestock population in the world, Indian livestock productivity is much lower than the global average, mainly because of poor health and diseases, including helminth parasitic infections. Fasciolosis, caused by the liver fluke *Fasciola hepatica* (in temperate region) and *F. gigantica* (in tropics and

sub-tropics), is a parasitic disease causing huge economic loss to livestock sector.

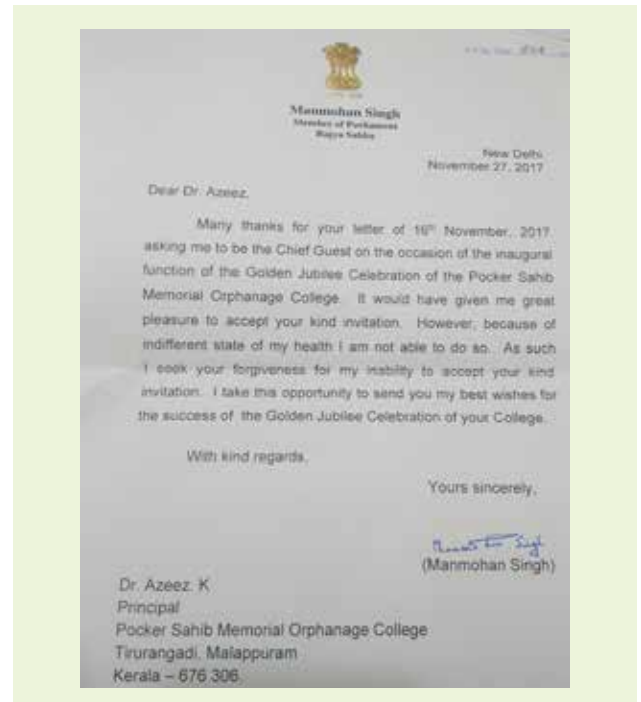
In the absence of a vaccine, triclabendazole (TCBZ) is the drug of choice to treat this disease both in human as well as animals due to its efficacy to both juvenile and adult stages. In the proposed study, the life cycle of *F. gigantica* will be established in the lab to ensure a regular supply of parasite material in order to overcome the problems associated with field infection.

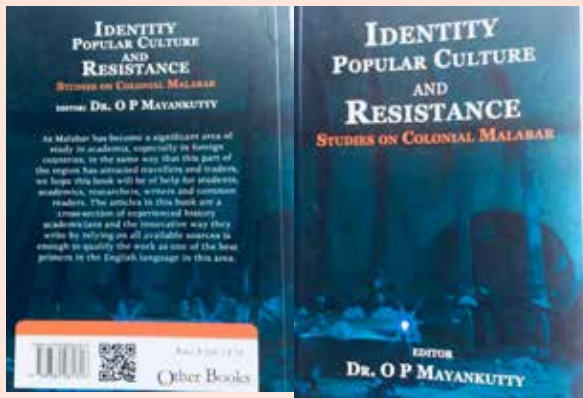
